
I wrote them down and collected those images that instinctually and immediately spoke to me and created a folder to keep them. This started in March and it hasn't ended.


When planning the final show for the year, I went back to this folder and list and started considering how the works related to one another, or if they related at all, and what it was about them that made me take notice and collect the imagery in the first place. I came to see that the thread that tied together so many of these works is that they have a very narrative quality; one that feels very personal. In fact, they feel semi-obsessive and as if they also could have been made at a time of confinement. There is a sense of angst but also a sense of humor and melancholy present in the works and, while there were many more artists that could have been part of the show, per se, I chose the following group to be in GEST because they made the most sense together. I am neither a scholar nor a linguist by any means, but searching for a title led me through a thesaurus web that started with the search: storytelling.



































Matthew Sweesy *Green Machine*, 2020 Colored pencil on paper 60 x 44 in 152.4 x 111.8 cm (MSW20.002)









Matthias Vriens Smörgåsbord I, 2010 Collage on paper 12 x 9 in 30.5 x 22.9 cm (MVR20.001)




Matthias Vriens Smörgåsbord II, 2010 Collage on paper 12 x 9 in 30.5 x 22.9 cm (MVR20.002)




Matthias Vriens Smörgåsbord III, 2010 Collage on paper 12 x 9 in 30.5 x 22.9 cm (MVR20.003)


Death or Glory, Just Another Story, 2020




Conrad Ruiz Man on Fire XII, 2020 Watercolor on paper 24 x 18 in 61 x 45.7 cm (CRU20.002)


















Oyster Hour, 2020




Orkideh Torabi
