


"Trump Supporters Rear Their Ugly Heads in a WeHo Exhibit" La Weekly April 27, 2016 By Catherine Wagley

Equal treatment

A woman with a champagne glass in hand scratches her back a few feet away from an expensive Rothko painting. Bemused and gleeful Trump supporters gather, wearing shirts with slogans such as "Blue Lives Matter." Two girls in cotton shorts cat-fight in an alley. A guy with midcentury taste, wearing a wife-beater, leans over his MacBook, which he's propped up beside a record player. All of these scenes and characters co-exist in Celeste Dupuy-Spencer's show at Mier Gallery. You don't notice at first that she's crossing class and taste divides, since she gives all her figures the same treatment. They're all awkward and flawed.
